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III. RECRUITMENT INITIATIVES

	Type of Recruitment Initiative	Brief Description of Activity
1	Participation in College Career Fair	The ERIE Radio Company participated in the Penn State Behrend Career and Internship Fair. On-air personality Amy Sasfai Petroff represented the station at the event on March 20, 2019 from 11am to 3pm. She spoke with students, collected resumes, and answered questions regarding careers in Communication and Media Broadcasting. The event was well attended...some were freshmen who still have a number of years in school, and there were also a few non-traditional (adult) students. The station representative spoke with 30-40 interested students about radio careers. Most were interested in technology and internship opportunities in the summer of 2019. Several students were seriously interested in internships, and we were able to identify 8 solid candidates to be interviewed in person at the station for an internship position this summer.
2	Internship Program – Summer 2018	Two students from local colleges served internship programs at the radio station from May 2017 through August 2017. This internship included hands-on experience in all aspects of radio that will be beneficial in all media platforms. The students helped prepare for community events with the public, and learned about programming, production, marketing, public relations,

		event planning, social media, research, and sales. Student Interns worked an average of 2 days each week from 10am to 2pm.
3	Internship Availabilities	Internship Opportunities are distributed at all local colleges and universities, seeking participants interested in WEHP's Internship Program. Selected individuals receive hands-on experience in all aspects of radio programming, production, promotions, marketing, public relations, event planning, social media, research and sales.
4	Station Tours	Station Tours are routinely held on request from adult and student organizations.
